### Aquatics Health & Safety Awareness Campaign

AMHSA's Aquatics Health & Safety Awareness campaign is designed to raise awareness of slips, trips, and falls for those working in and around pools. Funding for this project comes from a 2022 creative sentencing agreement to prevent injuries in aquatic facilities.

This campaign is designed to:

- Provide slip, trip, and fall prevention information to protect workers
- Raise awareness of OHS worker rights and supervisor responsibilities
- Support the Government of Alberta's OHS Prevention Initiative
- Remove employer barriers to OHS education by providing resources free of charge
- Bring awareness to aquatic safety best practices such as the <u>Aquatic Safety</u> Operator and Safety Recreation Facility Operator Certification program

AMHSA has collaborated with Alberta municipal members, Alberta Association of Recreation Facility Personnel (AARFP), Alberta Association of Aquatic Professionals (AAAP), Pool & Hot Tub Council of Canada - Alberta Chapter, and the Lifesaving Society - Alberta & NWT Branch to produce a micro-site, free injury prevention resources, and a live webinar series.

Webinar 1: Identifying slip, trip, and fall hazards

Date: March 26, 2024 (11:00 - 12:00 pm MDT)

This 45-minute webinar is presented by a fall protection engineering expert who will highlight known and overlooked slip, trip, and fall hazards in the aquatic pool working

environment. The subject matter expert will support you in strategizing how to start or enhance your existing fall protection program and how to identify hazards before selecting fall protection solutions.

Following the webinar, participants will have the opportunity to ask questions of our subject matter expert.

- Identify known slip, trip, and fall hazards and their contributing factors.
- Learn to create a strategy to identify slip, trip, and fall hazards.
- Create awareness of slip, trip, all fall hazards specific to work parties/departments.
- Review Alberta occupational health and safety legislation specifically, hazard assessment [AB OHS Code 7(1)], and Fall Protection General Protection [AB OHS Code139(1)].

# Webinar 2: Types of fall protection, including guardrails Date: April 30, 2024 (11:00 - 12:00 pm MDT)

This 45-minute webinar is presented by a fall protection engineering expert that will review when a fall protection plan and fall protection training are required. The subject matter expert will also discuss the hierarchy of controls specific for fall protection, and the types of systems, such as guardrails, travel restraint, fall arrest, and control zones. This general understanding is fundamental before creating a fall protection plan and implementing its systems.

Following the webinar, participants will have the opportunity to ask questions of our subject matter expert.

- Review when fall protection is required.
- Outline the hierarchy of controls specific for slips, trips, and falls.
- Identify the types of systems involved in the fall protection plan, such as: guardrails, travel restraint, fall arrest, and control zones.
- Review Alberta OHS legislation specifically, water danger [AB OHS Code 157], Fall Protection Plan [AB OHS Code140(1)], Instruction of workers [AB OHS Code141(1) and 141(3)], and fall protection hierarchy [AB OHS Code139(3) to 13(8)].

### Webinar 3: Fall protection plan and systems implementation

Date: May 30, 2024 (11:00 - 12:00 pm MDT)

This 45-minute webinar is presented by a fall protection engineering expert that will review the types of system in a fall protection plan, discuss the limitations of each system, and how to address the limitations to support building and implementing an effective fall protection plan.

This discussion includes understanding the requirements of anchoring points and providing examples of anchors commonly found in the aquatic pool working environment. Strategies of how to select fall protection systems will be presented including questions to ask the equipment manufacturer and the contractor installing the anchor points, prior to purchasing the equipment or service. Understanding the elements to develop an effective fall protection plan and implementing it, is vital to protecting workers at fall hazards.

Following the webinar, participants will have the opportunity to ask questions of our subject matter expert.

- Overview of parts a fall protection plan.
- Know the parts of a fall protection system.
- Classification of system limitations: guardrails, travel restraint, fall arrest, and control zones.

- Implement a fall protection system(s) and plan.
- Differentiate anchor point requirements from common anchor points found in the aquatic pool working environment.
- Formulate questions to ask manufactures or training providers prior to purchasing services or equipment.
- Review Alberta OHS legislation specifically, anchoring strength [AB OHS Code 152].
