Operational Procedures:

Operational procedures require the facility meet the minimum Alberta Legislation and Regulations. Lifesaving sport competition may require temporary alterations to these, for example, circulation may need to be turned down/off to minimize the movement of the manikins once they are placed.

Emergency Procedures:

Manluk Centre facility staff will notify the appointed Safety Officer of any major incident that occurs on site including any drowning, resuscitation, suspected spinal injury and possible fracture.

The Manluk Centre will be supervised by Lifesaving Society certified National Lifeguards that are employed by the City of Wetaskiwin. Employees will deal with emergencies per the Manluk Centre emergency procedures. The Wetaskiwin Chill management committee will assist with managing the participants and volunteers during an emergency.

Code of Conduct:

All volunteers, officials, competitors, and coaches should adhere to the Codes of Conduct outlined

in the most recent version of the ABNWT Competition Manual and any supporting rule book. The Wetaskiwin Chill Committee will be responsible for enforcement of these codes. Anyone not adhering to the safety procedures as prescribed in the above mentioned Competition Manuals may be disqualified or removed from the property. Unsafe actions and behaviors will not be tolerated.

Contingency Plans:

All contingency plans are decided by the Wetaskiwin Chill Committee. The committee has the right to postpone, reschedule, or cancel an event or competition if the venue is deemed unsafe.

General Safety:

- The Manluk Centre will adhere to the Alberta Legislation and Regulations as well as facility specific rules that will be followed for patron safety.
- Lifesaving Society Certified National Lifeguards will be supplied by the facility for the duration of the event.
- All general rules and procedures pertaining to competitions can be found in the most recent AB/NWT Competition manual and any supporting documents.

Major-Minor Incidents:

Manluk Centre facility staff will notify the appointed Safety Officer of any major incident that occurs on site including any drowning, resuscitation, suspected spinal injury and possible fracture.

The Manluk Centre will be supervised by Lifesaving Society certified National Lifeguards that are employed by the City of Wetaskiwin. Employees will deal with emergencies per the Manluk Centre emergency procedures. The Wetaskiwin Chill management committee will assist with managing the participants and volunteers during an emergency.

Medical Facilities:

On Site Service:

All first aid services can be provided within the Manluk Centre. It is at the discretion of the patient and/or Manluk Centre staff in accordance with emergency procedures as to whether a patient should be transported to a facility off-site.

City of Wetaskiwin Competition Safety Plan

Purpose:

The Wetaskiwin Chill Meet Committee has a safety and emergency plan for:

- The general safety of athletes, competition personnel and spectators during the competition.
- The Manluk Centre personnel and procedures are in place in case of minor or major incidents involving injury or illness of competitors, competition personnel and spectators.

The following overview will outline the facility that will be utilized during the Wetaskiwin Chill. It will clearly identify those authorized persons to initiate the Safety and Emergency Plan and outline command and control functions.

General procedures can be found in the Manluk Centre Emergency Procedures, in conjunction with Alberta Legislation and Regulations pertaining to pool operations.

The Host has a designated Safety Officer. The designated Safety Officer is to liaise with the Manluk Centre staff in regards to competition safety. The Manluk Centre will be required to report and document any incidents that occur at the facility during the event.

Manluk Centre staff will be responsible for initiating the Manluk Centre Emergency Safety Plan.
